

PA State Tax Credit Program

Do you want to direct where your PA Tax dollars are spent? Would you like to use your tax dollars to help a St. Ignatius family who is struggling to pay tuition? You can do that with one simple form.

Whether you are an individual who works for a non-profit or for-profit company or who owns your business, you can participate in the SPE (Special Purpose Entity) which allows you to obtain EITC (Educational Improvement Tax Credit) or OSTC (Opportunity Scholarship Tax Credit).

We are now working on PA Tax Credit for 2024.

It really is simple. You reach out to Dr. Wood, and fill in a form with a local scholarship foundation who handles all the steps for you. You write a check and receive a form that allows you to receive a 90% PA tax credit. For example, if you pay \$1,000 in taxes, you will receive a \$900 tax credit.


